



Management for horses during and after poor air quality

1. Do not exercise horses if air quality index exceeds 100.
2. Adapt ration fed in response to decreased work.
3. Control dust in horses' environment, including wetting hay.
4. Wait several weeks after air quality improves before restarting equine exercise., es
5. When air quality improves and exercise can resume, horses may have lost condition so level of work may need to regress until horse is re-conditioned.
